Message from DG Dave

My best Rotary greeting to each of you! Recently many of us joined our "Rotarians at Work Day". It's a time when many Rotarians indicate they feel closest to the reason they joined Rotary. When we are able to do good in the world, when we are able to help another person who may be in need, when we contribute to our community, it gives us the feeling of belonging. It brings joy to our hearts and meets a need.



There is no question that hands on opportunities provide this feeling and I encourage each club to find an ongoing opportunity to participate in a

hands on project; but the need for funding continues through our foundations. Locally we have The Gundaker Foundation and we ask for each Rotarian to consider a contribution annually of at least \$60. These funds will go toward scholarships, the Rotary Youth Exchange, and club projects both locally and internationally. The Rotary Foundation is where we partner with Rotarians around the world in funding many different projects and meeting a wide range of human needs. Again it helps to fund club projects locally and around the world, and goes toward the effort to bring about peace in the world, health to children and their mothers, literacy where it is needed, clean water, and economic development. If you have not done so already, I ask you to consider a year end contribution to The Rotary Foundation of at least \$100.

As I write this column, we have learned of the problems caused by severe weather in Oklahoma. While Rotary is often better at a response to help with clean up and rebuilding of the infrastructure than an immediate response, there is certainly a great need. Shelter Box has developed an immediate response that helps in many kinds of natural and manmade disasters. Bronwyn Martin, current president of the Kennett Square Club and 2013-14 AG for Area 8, has expressed a concern that we should be prepared to assist in the early stages of the recovery. She has proactively reached out to the Rotarians in the hardest hit area to ask what their needs may be. I ask that any of you, as individuals or Clubs, contact Bronwyn to find out how you may be used in this effort. Her e-mail is <u>ksrotary.bronwyn@gmail.com</u>. Rotary's 2013 convention will take place June 23-26 in Lisbon. All indications are that it will be well attended and bring a great deal of inspiration to all who attend. Many from our District have registered and Cheryl and I look forward to greeting you there. If you are attending and have not been made aware of our District dinner, it will take place on the evening of Tuesday, June 25th. We will need your reservation in advance. Grand opening at Kennett Square Playground

June 2 was the grand opening of the new Anson B Nixon Park playground which was Longwood Rotary Club's major 2012-2013 project . Completion of installation of the playground equipment April 6 marked the completion of the project. Since then, the playground area was successfully reseeded and

kid-tested. It passed with flying colors!

Longwood Rotary Club's \$50,000 investment was matched by the community for the purchase of the playground equipment. From April 4 to 6, Rotarians donated 350 hours of work which also was matched by community members from many businesses and other organizations.

"This project is the first large project we have undertaken in a number of years, and, like large projects we've done in the past, our community really got involved and gave us great support," said Longwood Rotary Club president George Gower. "The preparation over months became a really big three-day installation project. We needed the expertise of every one of the businesses involved to get the job done, from tree removal and ground preparation to final installation and seeding the grass afterward."

Businesses supporting the playground development included Bob's Cranes, Chadds Ford Trees, Dansko, Don Evans, Fence Experts, Heritage Concrete, Inniscrone Golf Course, Keating and Sons Excavating, Knox Equipment Rentals, Longwood Gardens, Southeastern Chester County Refuse Authority, and Wallace Landscaping.

Volunteers came from Longwood Rotary Club and all of the

participating companies as well as students from Kennett High School who are involved with either The Garage Student Center or the Walking In Knowledge program; students from the Southern Chester County Technical High School; the Friends of the Kennett Area Park Authority, the park's governing body; and community residents, some of whom simply stopped and volunteered as they were walking past the work site and realized they could help.



She is a co-founder of Parents United in Philadelphia for Public Education, a citywide parent group seeking greater investments in schools and classrooms, on the board of Asian Americans United, where she helped anchor a successful civil rights campaign focused on the responsibility of adults to create educational environments free from harassment, is a co-founder of Folk Arts-Cultural Treasures Charter School which supports community-based folk arts programming and serves many immigrant families in the city. This is the same school where the Rotary Club of Philadelphia volunteers recently painted stairwells and some school walls. She also is the former editor and a regular contributor for the Philadelphia Public School Notebook, an independent citywide education newspaper, and a national board member of Rethinking Schools, a social justice teaching journal. She was named Outstanding Asian Pacific American Community Leader of the Year in 2011.


West Chester Rotary Club honors student volunteers
